

Conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled, "An act imposing a tax, & prescribing the mode of collecting the same, in the privilege of selling Wine, Ardent Spirits, or Retail Liquors, within the limits of the Commonwealth of Virginia, for the support of the Government, & to pay the interest on the Public Debt" approved March 30th 1877, as amended by the Act approved April 2<sup>d</sup> 1877.

A Special License is this day granted to J. H. Marshall & John Davis, at their application to sell by the Drink in quantities of not more than one half pint, to be taken away from the place of delivery, but to be drunk at the place where sold, Wine, Ardent Spirits, Retail Liquors, Cider, or any Mixture thereof, at their place of business in this County, (the said Marshall & Davis & the said Davis & Crumple's Casing), for the period beginning on the first day of May & the first day of July 1877, & expiring on the thirtieth day of April 1877, the Court being fully satisfied that the applicants are fit persons, that their places of business are suitable & convenient, & that applicants having executed bonds as required by law, with good security payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in a sum of Five hundred dollars, Conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, "An Act imposing a tax & prescribing the mode of collecting the same, in the privilege of selling Wine, Ardent Spirits, or Retail Liquors, within the limits of the Commonwealth for the support of the Government, and to pay the interest on the Public Debt" approved March 30th 1877, as amended by the Act approved April 2<sup>d</sup> 1877.

All Matters and Causes depending in this Court, and not otherwise disposed of are Severally Continued, until the first day of the Next Term.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until the first day of the Next Term.
