

William Moore who Stands indicted of Felony this day appear'd in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered before T. J. Trotter a Justice of the Peace of this County & was set to the bar in Custody of the Sheriff of this County, & being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the Indictment & a panel of Sixteen persons of the thirty two Summoned by the Sheriff were examined by the Court found few from all legal exceptions & qualified to serve as jurors according to law, whereupon the accused promptly challenging few of said jurors and the remaining twelve to wit, G. W. Hill, A. S. McKey, G. E. Powell, W. C. Pirell, M. J. Knight, B. S. Knight, J. A. Carson, Joseph J. Williams, J. T. Beauchamp, Jas. N. Colby, C. C. Vaughan and J. E. Rond, who being elected sworn the Court of and upon the promise to speak & having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say "We the jury find the Prisoner Wm. Moore guilty, and upon cause his punishment to be Thirty Nine Stripes." And it being demanded of the Prisoner if anything he had or knew to say why the Court here should not send prison to pronounced judgment against him according to law, & there being nothing offered or alleged in delay of judgment it is Considered by the Court that the Said Wm. Moore receive Thirty Nine lashes on his bare back which the Sheriff of this County is directed to cause to be inflicted upon him, and that he thence be discharged from Custody And the Said William Moore is remanded to jail.

Riggins who Stands Indicted of felony was bid to the bar in Custody of the Justice of this Court & being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the Indictment and a panel of Sixteen persons of the thirty two Summoned by the Sheriff were examined by the Court found few from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law, whereupon the accused promptly challenging few of said jurors & the remaining twelve to wit, G. W. Williams, Adolphus Bradshaw, Octavius Hill, J. C. Moore, J. D. Cutler, J. E. Kelly, Chas. G. Edmunds, J. D. Kilchen, Charles Edwards, Hunter Colby, Byrd Gray & Jeptha Doty, who being elected & sworn the Court of and upon the promise to speak and having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say "We the Jury find the Prisoner not guilty" and whereupon proclamation being made as the Prisoner is an Working Farmer appeared to be being alleged against the said G. C. Riggins it is Considered by the Court that the Said G. C. Riggins be acquitted of the Felony of which he Stands charged and q. Sheriff without day.
