

William Moore who stands indicted of felony this day appears in Court in discharge of his recognizance entered into before J. J. Jackson a Justice of the Peace of this County & was set to the bar in Custody of the Sheriff of this County, & being thereof arraigned pleaded not guilty to the Indictment, & a panel of sixteen persons of the shery was summoned by the Sheriff were examined by the Court found free from all legal exceptions & qualified to serve as jurors according to law, whereupon the accused peremptorily challenged four of said jurors and the remaining twelve, to wit, J. W. Hill, T. S. Kilday, Geo. E. Vance, Wm. J. Swade, M. J. Knight, B. F. Knight, J. A. Carson, Joseph G. Williams, J. S. Beamon, Jas. N. Cobb, C. C. Vanghaust and J. E. Reed, who being elected tried of sworn the Court of and upon the promises to speak & having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say "We the jury find the Prisoner Wm. Moore guilty and upon their oath pronounce him to be thirty nine stripes." And it being demanded of the Prisoner if anything he had or wished to say why the Court had should not now proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, & there being nothing offered or alleged in delay of judgment it is considered by the Court that the said Wm. Moore receive thirty nine lashes on his bare back, which the Sheriff of this County is directed to cause to be inflicted upon said back, and that he then be discharged from Custody. And the said William Moore is remanded to jail.

Cobb, who being elected tried of sworn the Court of and upon the promises to speak and having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say "We the Jury find the Prisoner not guilty" and whereupon proclamation being made as the warmer is an "working further appearing & being alleged against the said J. O. Reggin it is considered by the Court that the said J. O. Reggin be acquitted and discharged of the felony of which he stands charged and go about without day.
