Certificate is granted them for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of Keyesick, Bradshaw died, in due form.

Ordered that A. D. Coby, H. D. Bradshaw, Albert Rufford & Charles E. Bradshaw, (or any three of them) being first duly sworn for the purpose, do appraise and the goods & chattels of Keyesick, Bradshaw died, & return the appraisement under their hands, as the law directs.

The last will & testament of Maria Drake died was proved by the Oath of Julius Fairclough & William Fairclough two of the Subscribing witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

On the Motion of R. P. Brything, who made Oath according to law, & together with H. M. Weymouth his security, (who justified in Oath as to his sufficiency) entered into & acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two hundred dollars, conditioned as the law directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of Boston Tiggs died, in due form.

Ordered that H. M. Weymouth, W. J. Richardson & H. H. Weymouth, (being first duly sworn for the purpose) do appraise and the goods and chattels of Boston Tiggs died, & return the appraisement under their hands as the law directs.

That of May & John J. Dyer, Commissioners of the Revenue for District No. 1 & 2 in this County, made report to the Court in accordance with the 8th Section of Chapter 25B. of the acts of Assembly 1876 & 77 approved March 26th 1877, which reports are ordered to be filed.

Ordered that the account of affrs. Josephine T. Spencer, Treasr of this County, amounting to One hundred & thirty dollars & twenty five cents, be certified to the Auditor of Public Accounts, for his examination & payment.

Ordered that the account of affrs. Josephine T. Spencer Treasr of this County, amounting to thirty three dollars for the maintenance & care of Thomas Pittman a Lunatic confined in the Jail of this County, it being proved to the Court that immediately after the commitment of the said Thomas Pittman, & at least once in every two months thereafter, application was made to the Board of Directors of said Asyl'um for admission, & that such application was refused for want of room.

Ordered that the Sheriff of Southampton County, discharged from the jail of this County, blessing himself upon his going & bond with security in the penalty of fifty dollars to keep the peace towards all the Citizens of this Commonwealth, the said bond can be executed before a Justice of the Peace of this County or a Commissioner in Chancery of this Court.
