On Consideration whereof & no Exceptions being filed to said report the same is hereby Confirmed. And the Court doth Order that C.C. Vaughan, out of any funds in his hands belonging to the Estate of W.B. Hollard pay off the Debts of Trust executed by W.B. Hollard in his life time at his Slave House & lot in Franklin provided the same do not exceed the sum of Two Thousand dollars, & that the said Slave house & lot be held by the said Doctor & his children of W.B. Hollard as a Homestead. When the said Trust debts are paid off, the said C.C. Vaughan, will take release deed, in which the said Slave house and lot will be conveyed by the said Doctor & his children, discharged of the liens of the aforesaid trust debts, as a Homestead subject to the limitations and conditions of the Statute, declaring in what Manner and on what Conditions a Homestead may be set apart & And the said C.C. Vaughan will report to Court, a copy of this Order is Ordered to be served upon the said Vaughan.

The Commissioners appointed at the last Term of this Court to let to the lowest bidder, the Keeping of the Marine Ferry for the year ending the 31st day of December 1879, this day made their report which is ratified and confirmed by the Court of Orders to be filed.

The Commissioners appointed at the last Term of this Court to examine and report whether a Boat is needed & necessary for the keeping of the Marine Ferry this day made their report which is confirmed by the Court of Orders to be filed and it is Ordered that the same Commissioners to wit, C.C. Whipple, Joseph J. Darden, of Allen H. Custer, purchased a suitable boat & for said Term of make report to Court.

The Commissioners appointed at the September Term last of this Court, to let to the lowest bidder, the repairs of the Bridge over Penn's Creek this day made their report according to same, which is ratified & confirmed by the Court, and Ordered to be filed.

A License is this day granted to S. Lewis & J. G. Johnson, on their application to sell by Retail only in quantities not to exceed one quart at any one time to any individual, above, evident spirits, Wine, Liquors, Cider, or any mixture thereof, which shall not be drunk within the limits of Charlottesville, but shall be delivered to the purchaser in bottles, jugs, decanters, or other vessels, to be removed therefrom, & also to sell by the Drink in quantities of not more than One half pint, not to be taken away from the place of delivery, but to be drunk at the place where sold, Wine, Spirit, Sperits, Wine Liquors, Cider or any mixture thereof at their places of business in this County, for the period beginning on the 1st day of December 1879, and expiring on the thirtieth day of April 1880 the Court being fully satisfied that the applicants are fit persons, & that their places of business are suitable & convenient, and the applicants having executed a bond as required by law, with good security, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in a sum of Two hundred dollars, conditioned to
