Johnston, here in Court, severally acknowledged themselves indebted to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the sum of fifty dollars, each, of their several goods & chattels, lands & tenements, to be levied to the use of the said Commonwealth, yet upon this condition, that if the said J. F. H. Biddle, J. W. Council, B. F. Love, Royal Jones, Walter Spence & John W. Johnston, should make their personal appearance before the Judge of this Court on the first day of the next term thereof, & give such evidence as they or each of them may know or believe of the Commonwealth against Nathan Oakland charged with felony, & shall not deposit thereof sufficient bond of the said Court, then this recognition to be void, otherwise to remain in full force & virtue.

F. Love be summoned to appear here on the first day of the next term of this Court, to show cause, if any they can, why they should not be fined for their said contempt.

Ordered that the account of Mrs. Josephine P. Wagnard, Justice of this County, amounting to ten dollars, be certified to the Clerk of Public Accounts for his examination and payment.

Ordered That The Court be adjourned until the first day of the next term
