

From 1877 to act as Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Hampshire, in relation to the Great Under-taking the keeping of the Ferry at South Quay for the year 1878. They made their report of the Court after becoming evidence before the payment of Twenty dollars, in addition to the ninety dollars already paid.

It being suggested to the Court that the Lands assigned as Taxes to Henry G. Nelson and J. J. Holmes, due by the Commissioners appointed at the February Term 1877, is excessive in value, being greatly more than its value, of all the lands of which the said J. J. Holmes died seized. It is Ordered that the said report be recommended to the said Commissioners, to wit, R. B. Poulton, C. H. Nelson, B. C. Lord, John J. Jones & John Holmes, with instructions to assess the same and return to Court together with a Statement under Oath of the Valuation paid by them upon the property and upon which the assessment is founded.

They day this Cause came on to be heard at the bill of the Complainant, Exhibit filed with said bill, the answer of the defendant B. J. Bryant, filed in Open Court, and was argued by Counsel, On Consideration whereof the Court did adjudge, Order and decree, that the injunction awarded the Plaintiff on the 18th March 1879, be and the same is hereby dissolved. And the Court did further decree that David H. Kendrick, (Trustee) proceed to execute the Deed of Trust made by Geo. H. Kendrick and Pauline his wife, the 13th of November 1873, according to its tenor. That he sell the real estate therein conveyed for Cash, after twenty days public notice, of time & place, by advertisement first at the Court and public places in Southampton, and by Counsel if parties, the said Kendrick is not required to execute any deed until the further Order of this Court. And the said Kendrick did report his proceedings under this Order to this Court.

On the petition of A. H. Bromley & others for leave to Open a Road Road from the Ferry at South Quay to the Town of Franklin, It is Ordered that A. L. Hordman, John H. Lawrence, William Beate, James Vanghel & or any four of them examine the route for said Road, and report to the Court the convenience & inconvenience that will result to individuals as well as to the public of South, and to Open as proposed, and report, clearly whether any Road, Orchard, Garden or any part thereof will in such case have to be taken.

An Inquisition taken Over the body of Richard C. Hale is returned and Ordered to be filed.

The Court certifies that William Vanghel, John C. Lough, J. E. Dession, D. D. Dwyer, J. H. Thayer, Geo. H. Lawrence, & H. C. Calk, C. H. Branch, & R. S. Bryant, are awarded to One dollar, each, for their services at this term, as Grand Jurors, to be paid.

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
