Oland, on their application to sell by Retail only in quantities up to five gallons at any one time to any one individual, Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liquors, Cider, or any Mixture thereof at their several places of business in this County, which shall not be drunk within the house or outlaye where sold, but shall be delivered to the purchaser in bottles, jugs, demijohns, or other vessels to be removed therefrom, for the period beginning on the 1st day of May 1879 & expiring on the 30th day of April 1880, the Court being fully satisfied that the applicants are fit persons and that their places of business are Suitable & Convenient, and the applicants having executed a bond with good security payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in a penalty of One hundred dollars, conditioned for a faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia entitled, "An act imposing a tax and prescribing the Mode of collecting the same or the privilege of Selling Wine, Ardent Spirits, or Malt Liquors, within the limits of the Commonwealth for the Support of the Government and to pay the interest on the public debt," approved March 30th 1877, as amended by the Act approved April 2^d 1877, and as amended by the Act approved April 15 1879.

✓ A Retail Board License is this day granted to M. C. Wheeler, and John P. Oland, on their application to sell by the Drinker, in quantities of not more than One half pint, not to be taken away from the place of delivery but to drink at the place where sold, Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liquors, Cider, or any Mixture thereof, at their places of business in this County, for the periods beginning on the 1st day of May 1879, and expiring on the 30th day of April 1880, the Court being fully satisfied that the applicant is a fit person and that their places of business are Suitable and Convenient, and the applicants having executed a bond with good security payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in a penalty of One hundred dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled, "An act imposing a tax and prescribing the Mode of collecting the same or the privilege of Selling Wine, Ardent Spirits or Malt Liquors within the limits of the Commonwealth for the Support of the Government and to pay the interest on the Public Debt," approved March 30th 1877, as amended by the Act approved April 2^d 1877, and as amended by the act approved April 15 1879.
