(On the Special Report of Com^r Tyler filed May 17th 1879, reporting that J. R. Prince
One of the execs of H. C. Pope did lay in his hands the sum of Twenty thousand
dollars belonging to the Estate of his Testator and desiring to be instructed in what
means he should invest the same. The Court doth hereby Order that the said
J. R. Prince may so invest, invest the same by bonds or real estate, which
shall be wholly situated in this State. The amount of which might be
at least fifty per cent more than amount loaned, the bonds to be secured by
Trust Deeds in effects if the loans be a married man his wife must
join, and the same to be free from incumbrance.

The Commissioners appointed at the last Term of this Court to
examine and report the advantages & disadvantages Costs of opening a
Road between Southbury and Franklin, this day made a Report which is
Continued until next Court and Ordered to be filed. And it is Ordered that
all the land owners through whose lands the Road will run & the said
Commissioners be summoned as witnesses before the Judge of this Court
on the first day of the next Term.

Ordered that the account of Dr. J. Lamb for, for the Examination
of Criminal Trials @ Lanesville, amounting to five dollars, be Certified to the
Auditor of Public Accounts, for his examination and payment.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until tomorrow Morning
