

of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, relative to the act imposing a tax and providing the mode of collecting the same, and the privilege of selling Wine, Godwin & Spirits or Malt liquors within the limits of the Commonwealth for the support of the Government, and to pay the interest on the public debt, approved March 30th 1877, as amended by the act approved April 2^d 1877, & as amended by the Act approved April 1st 1879."

X "Luther R Edwards who has been Commissioned a Notary Public for the County of Loudoun by the General Assembly of Virginia, under the Seal of the Commonwealth, the same date being the 18th day of May 1879, then day and John F. Edwards, his Security (who justified on Oath as to his Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five hundred dollars, Conditioned as the bond directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded. And the said Luther R Edwards, also took the Oath required by law."

X "William W. Briggs, who was on the 4th Thursday in May 1879, duly elected by the qualified voters of the County of Southampton, Sheriff thereof to serve as such for the term of four years, commencing on the 1st day of July 1879, and after the said term of Office shall have expired until his successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, then day appeared in Court of together with W. F. Broadhead, John R. Briggs, Joseph R. Briggs, & James E. Sebrell, his Securities, (who justified on Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty thousand dollars, Conditioned as the bond directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon the said William W. Briggs took the Oath required by law."

X "James E. Sebrell, who was on the 4th Thursday in May 1879, duly elected by the qualified voters of the County of Southampton, Treasurer thereof to serve as such for the term of four years, commencing on the 1st day of July 1879, and after the said term of Office shall have expired until his successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, then day appeared in Court of together with W. W. Briggs, Rufus O. Hurd, D. M. Rutz, Wm. J. Reed, Wm. H. Sebrell & B. H. Sebrell, his Securities (who justified on Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Fifty thousand dollars, Conditioned as the bond directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded. And thereupon the said James E. Sebrell took the Oath required by law."

X "Joseph B. Paine who was on the 4th Thursday in May 1879, duly elected Attorney for the Commonwealth in this Court for the term of four years, commencing on the first day of July 1879, and after said term of Office shall have expired until his successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, then day appeared in Court and qualified by taking the Oath of Office required by law."

X "William C. Gay who was on the 4th Thursday in May 1879, duly elected Commissioner of the Revenue in the first District of the County of Southampton, by the qualified voters of the said County, & thereupon

as such for the term of four years, commencing on the first day of July 1879, and after said term of Office shall have expired until his successor is qualified to enter upon the discharge of the duties of said Office, then day appeared in Court and qualified by taking the Oath of Office required by law."
