And the said Paul D. Oland took the Oath required by law.

R. C. Curd of R. F. Braham, who had been elected Justice of the Peace in the Agricultural District of Dorchester, at its election, held on the 4th Thursday in May 1879, by the qualified voters thereof for the term of two years, Commencing on the 1st day of July 1879, and to continue to discharge the duties of their Office, after their term expires until their Successors shall have been qualified, this day appeared in Court and qualified by taking the Oath required by law.
