of Robert Whitehead, who being elected, tried and sworn the Court
of and upon the promises to speak and hearing heard the evidence
upon their oath the day, "We the jury find the Prisoner guilty & for
his punishment to ten years imprisonment in the Penitentiary."
 And it being demanded of the Prisoner if anything for himself he
 had or knew to say why the Court should not pronounce judgment against
 him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in delay
 of judgment, it is considered by the Court that the said Peter Edwards
 be imprisoned in the Penitentiary, of this Commonwealth for the term of
 ten years the period by the jurors in their verdict ascertained. And
 it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do as soon as possible
 after the adjournment of this Court receive and safely convey the said
 Peter Edwards from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this Com-
 monwealth therein to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner
 directed by law. And thereupon the said Peter Edwards is remanded
 to jail.

 against him according to law, and nothing being offered or alleged in
 delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court that the said Peter
 Edwards be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth
 for the term of three years the period by the jurors in their verdict
 ascertained. And it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do as
 soon as possible after the adjournment of this Court receive and safely
 convey the said Peter Edwards from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this
 Commonwealth therein to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner
 directed by law.
