

On the Motion of T. J. Vaughan, who made Oath according to law, and registered with M. J. Vaughan & Governor Vaughan his Sureties, (who justified in Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into an acknowledgment & bond in the penalty of Eight hundred dollars, Conditioned as the law directs, Which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted him for Obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of M. J. Vaughan dec'd. in due form.

Ordered that James Vaughan, Geo. W. Cobb, Joseph J. Darden & Allen H. Cotton (or any three of them, being first duly sworn for the purpose) do approve the Estate of M. J. Vaughan dec'd. and return the appraisement under their hands as the law directs.

On the Motion of James C. Seibell, who made Oath according to law, and registered with H. C. Seibell his Sureties, (who justified in Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into an acknowledgment & bond in the penalty of One thousand Dollars, Conditioned as the law directs, Which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted him for Obtaining letters of administration de bonis non, with the Will annexed, of Kinchen Jackson dec'd. in due form.

On the Motion of P. A. Drury, who made Oath according to law, and registered with R. M. Stephenson his Sureties, (who justified in Oath as to their Sufficiency) entered into an acknowledgment & bond in the penalty of One thousand Dollars, Conditioned as the law directs, Which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted the said P. A. Drury for Obtaining letters of administration on the Estate of Spradley Pennington dec'd. in due form.

Ordered that R. M. Edwards, W. F. Bradshaw, & A. T. Cobb, (being first duly sworn for the purpose) do approve the goods & chattels of the Estate of Spradley Pennington dec'd. & return the appraisement under their hands as the law directs.

Ordered that upon James Bruch's giving & Bond in the penalty of One hundred dollars, to wit, One hundred dollars for himself, and One hundred dollars for his Sureties, to keep the peace for twelve months from the time he was committed to jail, that he be discharged from jail and the said bond may be given before the Clerk of the Court, or by any Justice of the Peace.
