

The Court having received information that Blank Water Bridge is in danger of being carried away by a raft, and lying against it, it is ordered that A. S. Stephenson, & M. A. Clayton, on the part of this County, with Commissioners acting on the part of said County, remove said raft & report the state thereof to this Court.

James D. Byrd, Surveyor of the Board Water Road from James Middle to the Top of New, this day tendered his resignation, which the Court accepts, and J. T. Branch, is appointed in his stead.

James H. Holt, Surveyor of the Board Bridge Road, this day tendered his resignation, which the Court accepts & doth appoint W. H. Stephenson in his stead.

The bounds on the lands of B. F. Hundley at Vicksburg, are changed from existing in the Road from Jerusalem to Vicksburg & transferred to the Road from Vicksburg to the Service Run. W. H. Holt, Surveyor.

On the petition of William Langley, Robert Barlow & Solomon Britt & for reasons appearing to the Court, they are exempted from the payment of taxes & duties in future, they being aged and infirm.

The Commissioners appointed to receive the repairs of George Bridge this day made Report receiving the same, which is approved by the Court and ordered to be certified to the Board of Supervisors.

It appearing from the Report of the Commissioners appointed at the April Term last of this Court, to examine & report the advantages & disadvantages of opening a Road between South Quay & Frankfort, that the work will cost upwards of nine thousand dollars, it is ordered that the Court be certified to the Board of Supervisors.

John J. Hendricks, Commissioner of Accounts in this Court, this day released his Report under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 15, 1879, Examining the Official Book of James C. Seale, Treasurer of this County, which is approved by the Court and ordered to be filed.

Elizabeth Ann Johnson, had permission to bind her Infant children William and Joseph to Elizabeth R. Bond.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until the first day of the next Term.
