Corbett, and Isaac Caron, sworn in Court and sent to the Grand Jury, and against." And the said Grand Jury hearing nothing further to present were discharged.

Jacob Gardner, who stands indicted of Burglary was long dry but the bar in custody of the jailer of this Court, and being thereof persuaded pleaded not guilty to the indictment. And the panel of sixteen persons summoned by the Sheriff, were examined by the Court found free from all legal exceptions and qualified to serve as jurors according to law. Thereupon the accused peremptorily challenged four of the jurors, and the remaining twelve to wit, J. W. Ridley, Charles Knight, Elijah Jones, James Campbell, A. W. Grogan, G. W. Majette, J. R. Porter, James H. Burch, James R. West, J. C. Brown, L. L. Story, and J. J. Dickerson, who having elected, tried and sworn, the Court of said upon the promises to speak, and hearing heard the evidence, upon their Oath do say, "We the jury find the Prisoner guilty, and fine him three in the State Penitentiary to five years." And it being demanded of the Prisoner if anything for himself he had or knew to say why the Court had stand out and proceed to pronounce judgment against him according to law, and making being offered no alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court that the said Jacob Gardner be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth for the term of five years the period by the jurors in their verdict ascertained. And it is considered that the Sheriff of this County do as soon as possible after the arraignment of the Court, remove and safely convey the said Jacob Gardner, from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth, therein to be kept imprisoned and treated in the manner prescribed by law. And thereupon the said Jacob Gardner is remanded to jail.
