

The report of Commissioner R. S. Barlow, Waverly Barlow & Henry Pope, appointed at the last Term of this Court to examine the Waverly Road, running from the Jerusalem Road near the Indian Bridge to Appleton Church, with a view of making it a public Road, was received & approved, and it appearing that the parties through whom the Road passes grant without compensation the right of way through the lands. It is therefore Ordered that the said Road be adopted as a public highway and that Wm. J. Collier, be appointed Surveyor thereof and that the following lands do unto them, to wit, the heirs living of the lands of M^{rs} G. G. Gish, I. C. Appleton, Est of J. C. Gish, Henry R. Miller, M^{rs} Susan Gentry Est of Wm. J. Gentry, & the heirs living between said Road & Kittering River, from said bridge land to the Jerusalem Road at the Indian Bridge.

The report of Commissioners Henry Ferguson, appointed at the last Term of this Court, to examine the Road leading from the Jerusalem Road near the Kittering Mill to the Cypress Bridge Road, with a view of making it a public Road was received & approved, & it appearing to the Court that the parties through whom the Road passes grant without compensation the right of way through their lands. It is therefore Ordered that the said Road be adopted as a public highway & that J. W. Reddy, be appointed Surveyor thereof & that the following lands do unto them, to wit, the heirs of the lands of Henry Ferguson, H. D. Pope's whole lot from and of W. Reddy's.
