

The report of Commissioner R. F. Bartlein, Wm. H. Bartlein & H. R. Phipps, appointed at the last Term of this Court to examine the Road running from the Jerusalem Road near the Indian Bridge to Applewhite Church, with a view of making it a public Road, "Was received, and it appearing that the Party through whom lands are held, grant without compensation the right of way through their lands. It is therefore Ordered that the said Road be adopted as a public highway and that Wm. J. Gillette, be appointed Surveyor thereof, and that the following Roads do work thereon to wit, the Roads leading to the lands of Mr. G. A. Stirt, J. C. Applewhite, Est. & Jacob Whitehead, to R. Kelle, Mrs. Susan Lantz, Est. of Wm. J. Gray & the Roads leading between said Road & Pittman River from said Gray's Land to the Juniper Road at the Indian Bridge.

The report of Commissioner Henry Ferguson, appointed at the last Term of this Court to examine the Road leading from the W. side also N. side of the road from Ridley Hill to the Cypress Bridge Road, with a view of making it a public Road was received & approved, & it appearing to the Court that the party through whom lands the said parties grant without compensation the right of way through their lands. It is therefore Ordered that the said Road be adopted as a public highway & that J. W. Ridley be appointed Surveyor thereof & that the following roads do work thereon to wit, the said roads on the lands of Henry Ferguson, G. D. Piper while leased from J. W. Ridley.
