

then One half pint not to be taken away from the place of delivery, but to be drunk at the place where sold, Wine, Ardent spirits, Malt Liquors, Cider, or any mixture thereof, at this place of business in this County for the period beginning on the 1st day of November 1879, and expiring on the 30th day of April 1880, the Court being fully satisfied that the applicants are fit persons, and that their place of business and Suitableness and Convenience, and the applicants having executed a bond as required by law with good Security, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in a penalty of Two hundred Dollars, Conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled, An Act imposing a tax and prescribing the Mode of Collecting the Same, in the privilege of Selling Wine, Ardent Spirits, or Malt Liquors within the limits of the Commonwealth for the Support of the Government & to pay the interest on the Public Debt, approved March 30th 1877, as amended by the Act approved April 2^d 1877, and as amended by the Act approved April 1st 1879.

And License is this day granted to Wm. H. Morris, Joseph H. Perkins, Jacob H. Holland, J. A. and B. T. Handley, N. A. Savage, James L. Bishop, and Charles W. Cook, on their application to sell by Retail only in quantities up to five gallons, at any One time, to any One individual, Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liquors, Cider or any mixture thereof, at their place of business in this County, which shall not be drunk upon the premises or Carriage Stand but shall be delivered to the purchaser in bottles, jugs, demijohns, or other Vessels, to be consumed elsewhere, for the period beginning the said Parliament & Rollcall on the 30th Oct. 1879, the said Morris & J. A. & B. T. Handley and Savage on Dec. 1st 1879 and the said Bishop & Cook on Nov. 17th 1879, and expiring on the thirtieth day of April 1880. The Court being fully satisfied upon hearing the evidence that the applicant is a fit person and that the place of business is Suitable and Convenient, and that the Applicant has required by law has been paid to the proper Officer, and the applicant having executed a bond as required by law with good Security payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in a penalty of Two hundred Dollars, Conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled, An Act imposing a tax and prescribing the Mode of Collecting the Same in the privilege of Selling Wine, Ardent Spirits, or Malt Liquors within the limits of the Commonwealth for the Support of the Government & to pay the interest on the Public Debt, approved March 31st 1877, as amended by the Act approved April 2^d 1877, and as amended by the Act approved April 1st 1879.

The Court did also appoint Luther K. Edwards a Justice of the Peace in the Franklin Magisterial District, in this County, in the place of J. A. Sells removed from the County, & thereupon the said Edwards qualified by taking the Oaths required by law.
