

A License is this day granted to J. D. Boggs
on his application to sell by Retail one in
quantities up to five gallons, at any one time,
any one individual, Wine, Ardent Spirits,
Malt Liquors, Cider, or any mixture
thereof, at his Place of Business in this
County, Which Shall not be drunk within
the House or Curtilage where sold, but
Shall be delivered to the purchaser in
Bottles, Jugs, Demijohns, or other Vessels, to
be removed therefrom, for the period beginn-
ing February 1st 1880 and expiring on the
thirtieth day of April 1880, the Court
being fully satisfied upon hearing the
evidence, that the applicant is a fit person,
and that the place of Business is suitable
and convenient, and that the Specific
tax required by law has been paid to the
proper Officer, and the applicant having
executed a bond as the ~~penalty~~ of required
by law, with good security and payable
to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in a
penalty of Two Hundred Dollars, condition-
ed for the faithful performance of all the
requirements of the act of the General Assembly
of Virginia entitled "An act imposing a tax
and prescribing the mode of collecting the
same on the privilege of selling Wine,
Ardent Spirits or Malt Liquors within
the limits of the Commonwealth for the
support of the Government and to pay the
Public Debt" approved March 30th 1877, as
amended by the act approved April 2nd 1877,
and as amended by the act passed
April 1st 1879.
