 of this County, and having received their oaths withdrew, and the
 Session returned into Court and proceeded.

An Indictment against W. W. Wren for Felony, "It a true bill"

 An Indictment against Schenck & Morris Squier, for a
 Misdemeanor, a true bill, and the said Grand Jury hearing nothing
 further to present were discharged.

Charles Kinley, who stands indicted of felony, was this day set to the
 bar in Court of the District of this Court, and having thereof assigned counsel
 not guilty to the Indictment and a panel of Stationers summoned by the
 Sheriff, were examined by the Court, found free from all legal exceptions and
 qualified to serve as jurors according to law, whereupon the several persons
 being challenged from the jurors, and the remaining twelve, to wit, S. J.
 Squier, Robert Blythe, James Beale, J. E. Squier, W. C. Brantley, E. J. Squier, Joseph
 J. Gordon, Roger Gray, L. W. Beale, C. M. Barrett, T. A. Bullock, & Joseph
 H. Gray, who being elected tried and sworn the oath of and upon the
 promise to speak and having heard the evidence upon their Oaths do say:
 "We the Jury find the prisoner guilty of, ascertain the term of his
 imprisonment in the State Prison to be two years: And he having dem-
 onstrated if the prisoner of anything for himself he had a power to say,
 why the Court heard should not be proceeded to pronounced Judgment upon
 him according to law, and there being nothing offered or alleged in
 delay of Judgment, it is Considered by the Court that the said
 Charles Kinley be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Government
 for the term of two years, the period of the term in which he is
 contained. And it is Ordered that the Sheriff of this County do as soon
 as possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove and safely carry
 the said Charles Kinley from the jail of this Court to Penitentiary &
 this Government thence to be kept imprisoned and treated in the
 manner prescribed by law. And thereupon the said Charles Kinley
 is removed to jail.

On the Motion of Wm. E. Myrick, One of the Executors of the
 Pope dec'd. it is Ordered that the Order of endorsement made at the
 May Term 1819, of this Court, be annulled, so as to allow the
 said Executor to deposit money in his hands belonging to the
