On motion of the appellant by his Attorney and for reasons appearing to the Court this cause is continued until the next term of this Court at the Appellate Court.

The Court doth appoint James H. Johnson as Guardian of his infant children Maggie H. Nannie E. and James B. Johnson, and thereupon the said James H. Johnson together with J. E. Biston his security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars conditioned as the law directs, which bond is ordered to be recorded.

The Last Will and Testament of Matilda J. Melms was fully proved by the oath of ^{the other surviving just parties} Wm. W. Galt, and ordered to be recorded.

On the motion of A. G. Barham, who made oath according to law, and together with W. A. Reese her security (who justified on oath as to his sufficiency) entered into and acknowledged a Bond in the penalty of Three Thousand Dollars conditioned as the law directs, ^{the other surviving just parties} which bond is ordered to be recorded.

Ordered that J. E. Primer, J. H. Horace and J. H. Prince after being first duly sworn for the purpose do appraise all the goods and chattels of A. G. Barham decd. and make report to Court.

On the motion of A. B. Urquhart for permission to erect a Gate ^{a By-law} across the Public Road leading from Jerusalem to Petersburg near the residence of in this County to the Sussex line. It appearing to the Court that notice of said application has been duly posted at the Court house door of this County and two public places, at or near said Urquharts where said Gate is proposed to be erected, the Court doth allow the said application.

Ordered that G. P. Pope, S. C. Everett, H. D. Barham and W. B. Ridley (any three whom may act) be appointed Commissioners to set to the lowest undertaker the repairs of the Bridge over Angelica Swamp near Long Sign and report to Court.

On the motion of C. W. Nicholson and J. E. Sebrall ^{attorneys} of J. A. Keith it is ordered that R. C. Pope, J. A. West, Henry Ferguson, P. G. Little, and Robert Whitburn be appointed Commissioners (any three of whom
