place where sold Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liqueurs or any
mixture thereof Alcoholic Bitters, or Drinks preserved in
Ardent Spirits at their Places of Business in this County
for the period beginning on the 1st day of May 1880 and
expiring on the 30th day of April 1881. The Court being
fully satisfied upon hearing the evidence that
the Applicants are fit persons and that their
places of business are suitable and convenient and
that the specific Tax required by law has been paid
to the proper officer, and the Applicants having
executed a bond as required by law with good
Security payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in
a penalty of One hundred Dollars conditioned
for the faithful performance of all the requirements
of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia entitled
An Act imposing a Tax and prescribing regulations
for collecting the same, on the privilege of selling
Wine, Ardent Spirits, or Malt Liqueurs or any mixture
thereof within the limits of the Commonwealth
for the support of the Government and to pay the
interest on the Public Debt. apprond March 3rd 1880.
