On the Special Report of Com. J. R. Tyler, filed May 17th 1880, reporting that J. J. Woodard one of the Executors of B. E. Sp. de. has in his hands belonging to the estate of his said late wife some of Lewis Howard dollars, and further reporting that the said late executor would in the course of administration receive other sums of money and desiring to be instructed by the Court in what manner he should invest the same. The Court doth hereby, adjudge, Order and direct, that the said executor deposit the said sum of Lewis Howard dollars, and any other moneys he may receive in the course of his administration in the Merchants National Bank of Norfolk Va. and take a Certificate of Deposit therefor, in his name as Executor as aforesaid.

The Report of the Commissioner to let the repairs of Mephanburgs Mill Bridge having been submitted to the Board of Supervisors & having been read and its approval. It is Ordered that J. J. Biddle, Charles Edwards, & Elly Boyant, Commissioners heretofore appointed, take the said and liberally from the undertaker for the faithful performance of his contract, receive the said work when completed, and make report to Court.

At a Court of the County of Loudoun, Va. held at the Court House on the 17th day of May 1880.
Present: J. J. Biddle, Charles Edwards, & Elly Boyant, Commissioners.
The Defendants by their attorney say they are not guilty in person and from as in the Indictment against them in allegd and if they stay put themselves upon the County, and the attorney for the Commonwealth let the same, and thereupon came a jury to wit, George Lott, Elly Boyant, Geo. W. Lawrence, for H. Dwyer, H. D. Vicks, J. B. Crumpler, L. J. Gardner, all of Loudoun, C. C. Williams, Henry Crumpler, Henry Jordan, & Henry Boyant, who being elected tried and sworn the truth to speak upon the issue joined and having heard the evidence upon their oaths do say "We the jury find Ismael Archer and Martha Jaynes guilty."
Wherefore it is considered by the Court that the said Ismael Archer and Martha Jaynes be fined one hundred dollars each and the costs of this prosecution. And the said Ismael Archer is to be kept in Jail until he is discharged to give security for his good behavior until the further order of the Court.
Ordered that the Report of the Commissioners appointed at the last term of this Court be let to the lowest undertaker for repairs, B. Everett Bridge, as appears of the Court and Certificate, to the Board of Supervisors, and be committed to the same Commissioners for a further report of the matter.
