The last Will and Testament of Anne Davis dec'd. as provided by the Code of Joseph H. Johnson of Arlington, Gardner the Subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of John D. Johnson, executor thereof, and the Judge Clerk accordingly to that he signed with James E. Edwards of Arlington, Gardner, his Councilor, (who professes as Clerk as to this sufficiency) entered into an acknowledgment in law in the presence of two hundred dollars, Conditional as the last directs. Which has been ordered to be recorded. Conditional as granted the said John D. Johnson for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form.

The last Will and Testament of Charles Knight dec'd. as provided by the Code of James J. Gordon of Charles Knight, the Subscribing witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. James J. Gordon here as Clerk refused to take upon himself the burden of the Probation of the will.

Ordered that Arlington, Gardner, Joseph H. Johnson of John Helling (being first duly sworn for the purpose) do appraise as the goods and chattels of Anne Davis dec'd. and return the appraisement under their hands as the last directs.

C. Briggs, Thos. Vaughan, Esq. Jas. E. Seibel, his clerk, who were duly qualified as to their sufficiency, entered into and acknowledged in open Court a bond in the Penalty Five Thousand Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of his office according to law, which bond is ordered to be recorded by the Clerk of this Court, who is also directed to transmit a copy of this order, said bond and a copy of this order to the Auditor of Public Accounts, and thereupon the said Norfolk B.
