On the recommendation of Merritt Branch it is ordered that George H. Shirey an overseer of the poor, bind out according to Law, to Wesley Branch, to learn the art of Agriculture, Merritt Kitchen a poor boy, aged eleven years until he shall attain the age of twenty one years. And it is ordered that at the said Wesley Branch pay, at the expiration of the said apprenticeship to the said Merritt Kitchen with interest from the 24th day of June 1880, the sum of \$200, and that the said George H. Shirey overseer of the poor aforesaid take from the said Wesley Branch board without good security for the punctual payment of said sum.

A License is this day granted to W. H. Pickett, Samuel Thomas, R. H. B. Cobb, & D. S. Thomas on their application to sell by Retail only in quantities up to five gallons at any one time to any one individual Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liquors or any mixture thereof, Alcoholic Bitters or Drums preserved in Ardent Spirits in quantities not exceeding five gallons at any one time to any one individual, at their places of business in this County, which shall not be drunk within the house or curtilage where sold, but shall be delivered to the purchaser in bottles, Jugs, Demijohns or other vessels to be used therefrom for the period beginning 1st day of May 1880, and expiring on the 30th day of April 1881. The Court being fully satisfied, that upon hearing the evidence that the applicants are fit persons and that their places of business are suitable and convenient, and that the specific tax required by Law has been paid to the proper officer, and the applicants having executed a Bond as required by Law with good security, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the penalty of One hundred Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the act of the General Assembly of Virginia entitled "An act to establish a Tax and prescribing regulations for collecting the same and the privilege of selling Wine, Ardent Spirits or Malt Liquors or any mixture thereof within the limits of the Commonwealth for the support of the Government and to pay the interest on the Public Debt approved March 3rd 1880.

A Barroom License is this day granted to H. H. Pickett and R. H. B. Cobb on their application to sell by retail not to be taken away from the place of delivery, but to be drawn at the place where sold, Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liquors or any mixture thereof, Alcoholic Bitters or Drums preserved in Ardent Spirits, at their places of business in this County for the period beginning on the 1st day of May 1880, and expiring on the 30th day of April 1881.
