against T. A. Bishop Appellee } upon an appeal

This day came the parties by their attorneys
and by consent of parties the following jury
to wit: Jesse Dickens, Geo. W. Mellar, Alexander
Layner, John P. Bland, J. M. Williams, J. B. Comstock
and A. L. Bradshaw who being sworn well and
truly to try this cause according to Law & Evidence
after hearing the evidence upon their oaths do say
"That the jury find for the Plaintiff and assess his
damages at \$14,700 with interest from the 12th day
of December 1879." Whereupon it is considered by
the Court that the said T. A. Bishop recover against
the said S. Lewis ^{the} sum of \$14,700 with interest thereon
upon the Appeal aforesaid the said sum of
Seventeen and 700 Dollars with interest thereon
as aforesaid and his costs by him expended
before the Justice and also his costs expended
in defense of said Appeal.

Ordered that Thos. A. Bishop be and is hereby appointed
to put in proper and necessary repairs the two ditch
bridges on the road which leads from the
by pass bridge to Pochellie's old Depot, the
said Bishop being empowered to employ hands
and team to complete the said work, to keep a
regular account of the same, including his own
services. And should the said costs be less than
the sum of Thirty Dollars the Treasurer after
receiving the Court's Certificate shall pay the
same to whom the money may be due.

Ordered that P. W. Plythe be and is hereby appointed
to put in proper and necessary repairs the little
and last bridge on embankment at Tinsbury,
the said Plythe being empowered to employ hands
and team, to complete the said work, to keep a
regular account of the same, including his
own services. And should the said costs be
less than the sum of Thirty Dollars the
Treasurer after receiving the Court's Certificate
shall pay the same to whom the money may be due.

Ordered that in case of default of the
first day of the month of January and
Hugh Cain who stands convicted of Petit Larceny and
who was committed to Jail until the cost of the
Prosecution is paid, being brought into Court and
