

James H. Jager, who stands indicted of felony does this day shew to the Court in
custody of the jailer of this Court, being himself arraigned, pleaded not guilty of
to the Indictment, & a panel of six persons, summoned by the Sheriff
were examined by the Court found him a legal reception & qualified to
serve as jurors according to law, whereupon the accused peremptorily challenged
four of the jurors of the remaining twelve to wit, B. D. McLennan, R. B. Jager,
John T. Dorsey, John Williams, M. D. Harris, Jack Kido, W. J. Mcintosh,
J. H. Powell, James H. Dorsey, W. J. Wiggins, W. D. Griffin &
B. E. Beate, who being elected tried & heard the Court of & upon the pro-
mise to speak, & having heard the evidence upon these facts do say, "As the
jury find the Prisoner guilty, & ascertain his term of imprisonment in the Penitentiary
to be twelve years, and it being demanded of the Prisoner if anything for himself
he had or knew to say why the Court should show not send him to prison, &
judgments against him according to law & there being nothing offered or
alleged in delay of judgment, it is considered by the Court that the said
James H. Jager be imprisoned in the Penitentiary of this Commonwealth
for the term of twelve years, the period by the jurors in their verdict ascer-
tained, and it is ordered that the Sheriff of this County do as soon as
possible after the adjournment of this Court, remove & safely carry the said
James H. Jager from the jail of this Court to the Penitentiary of this Com-
monwealth, there to be kept imprisoned & treated in the manner prescribed
by law, and thereupon the said James H. Jager is remanded to jail."
