

The Court did appoint Joseph Turner, Surgeon of the Road leading from the gate of Road near Jos St. Parkland to the Commencement of the first end of the Court, which went to Jos St. Parkland or the "White Horse".

And James of Lesmer is appointed Surgeon of the Road leading from R. S. Paper's Account to the road near the Parkland place on the Road near Whitehead's Church, in the place of Stroffert B. Shirley, this day resigned.

Ordered that the following should be left, I find in the List of John Davis for John Davis Sr., John Davy, Walter Cook, William Davis, Collier Kelahan, Benjamin Gardner, Jas Edwards, James Turner, Jerry Chappin, J. W. Johnson, Charles Johnson, Frank Smith, Mary Harris, Robert Harris, and of J. Johnson, be transferred to the Road over which, of J. Johnson is Surgeon.

A License is this day granted to J. L. Davy, & Dr. R. S. Potts and Thomas E. Potts on their application to sell by Retail only, in quantities up to five gallons at any one time, to any one individual Wine, Acent Spirits, Malt Liquors or any mixture thereof Alcoholic Bitters or Tincts preserved in Acent Spirits in quantities not exceeding five gallons at any one time, to any one individual, at their places of Business in this County, which shall not be drunk within the House or enclosure, where sold, but shall be delivered to the purchaser, in bottles, Jugs, Demijohns or other vessels, to be removed therefrom for the period beginning 20th day of September, and expiring on the 30th of April, 1881. The Court being fully satisfied, that upon hearing the evidence, that the applicants are fit persons and that their places of Business are suitable and convenient and that the specific Tax required by Law has been paid to the proper officer, and the applicants having executed a Bond as required by Law with good Security, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the penalty of one hundred Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of all the requirements of the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled "An Act imposing a Tax, and prescribing regulations for collecting the same on the privilege of selling Wine, Acent Spirits, or Malt Liquors or any mixture thereof within the limits of the Commonwealth, for the support of the Government and to pay the interest on the Public Debt." Approved March 2nd, 1880.

The Court also allow John Dickins, Esq; W. Miller, Alexander Dyer, Dr. P. Bland, Dr. Williams, J. B. Sumpter, and J. P. Parashaw, one dollar each for their services at the last Term of this Court in the trial of civil causes, to be paid out of the County Levy.
