A License is this day granted to Wm. R. Brown, John A. Humbley,
John A. Bellman & N. B. Plaster, on their application to sell by
Retail only in quantities up to five gallons, at any one time, to any one
individual, Wine, Ardent Spirits, Malt Liquors, or any Mixture thereof,
Blended Brandy, or Brandy processed in Ardent Spirits, in quantities
not exceeding five gallons, at anytime to any one individual at their several
places of business in this County, which shall not to do so, within the
limits of Counties where sold, but shall be delivered to the purchaser
in bottles, jugs, demijohns, or other vessels, to be removed therefrom
for the purpose beginning on the 18th day of October 1880, & expiring
on the 30th day of April 1881, the Court being fully satisfied upon
hearing the evidence, that the applicants are fit persons and that
their places of business are suitable and convenient, and that the
specifications required by law have been paid to the proper Officer,
and the applicants having executed and a required by law, with
good Security, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, in the
penalty of One hundred dollars, (conditioned for the faithful
performance of all the requirements of the Act of the
General Assembly of Virginia, entitled An act imposing a
Tax and prescribing regulations for Collecting the same, on the
privilege of Selling Wine, Ardent Spirits or Malt Liquors,
or any Mixture thereof, within the limits of the Commonwealth
for the support of the Government & to pay the Interest on the
"Public Debt" approved March 3rd 1880.
