This Indenture made the eighteenth Day of August in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and forty nine — Between Robert Bryant and Ann Bryant his Wife of the County of Southampton Planters of the one part And John Thomas of the County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Robert Bryant and Anne his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of seventy five pounds Current Money of this Colony to them in hand paid well and truly paid before the en sealing and delivery hereof by the said John Thomas the Receipt whereof they hereby Acknowledge and themselves therewith fully Contented satisfied and paid That given granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed Released Conveyed and Confirmed and by these presents Doth for themselves their Heirs Executors and Admrs. fully freely and absolutely give grant bargain sell Alien enfeoff release convey and fully Confirm unto the said John Thomas his Heirs Executors and Assigns forever two Certain Parcels or Tracts of Land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton on the South side of Nettoway River Beginning at a Gum on the South side of Tarrant Creek thence South fifty Degrees West two hundred and five Poles to a Pine then North fifty Degrees West one hundred and five Pole to a White Oak Then North twenty Degrees West One hundred and fifty four Pole to a Gum by the side of the byrups Branch then down the various Courses of the Run of the said Branch to Tarrant ^{Creek} aforesaid and down the various Courses of the Run of the said Creek to the Beginning it being a Patent formerly granted to Thomas Pitman bearing date
