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Know all Men by these Presents that I Arthur Whitehead of Southampton County in Virginia for divers good Causes and Consideration but more especially for the good Will and Affection I bear to my loving Son Lewis Whitehead in the same County and in Virginia me hereunto moving have given & granted and by these Presents do give grant and Confirm unto the said Lewis Whitehead three Parcels of Land all in Southampton County on the south side of Mattomay River bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning at a marked Cypress on the East side of Arthurs Swamp just above the Mouth of a small Branch a corner Tree of John Allens Land then by Allens Lines East by South two hundred & twenty pole to a Red Oak and South twenty Degrees East forty seven Poles to a Gum over the Run of the Branch a corner Tree of Edward Powers Land then down the various courses of the Run of the said Branch to Arthurs Swamp aforesaid and up the various courses of the Run of the said Swamp to the Beginning The Patent bearing Date the twenty fourth Day of March One thousand seven hundred and twenty five in the twelfth Year of our Reign Containing 125 Acres likewise one hundred and seventy five Acres of Land which I Purchased of William Powers of North Carolina being given him by the Will of his Father Edward Powers likewise two hundred and fifteen Acres of Land being part of a Patent bearing Date the thirtieth Day of August One thousand seven hundred and forty three in the seventeenth Year of our Reign bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning at a white Oak and East thirty Poles to a Parcel of small Hickory Saplings a corner of John Bohouns Land then by Bohouns Line North by East one hundred and forty four Poles to a Gum a corner of Jacob Brakes Land then by Brakes Lines North West one hundred and forty eight Poles to a Pine and West fourteen Poles to a Pine a corner of the said Whiteheads other Land then by his own old Lines South thirty eight Poles to a Pine South thirty Degrees West fifty four Poles to a Black Oak and South seventy Degrees West one hundred and fifty four Poles to a Pine a corner of Thomas Davis's Land from thence by a line of marked Trees to the beginning All and singular my Right and Title Ratifying
