Ten pounds Thirteen Shillings and Seven pence Cash to me in
hand at and Before the sealing and Delivery of these presents
well and truly paid of Richard Richs the Receipt whereof I do
hereby acknowledge and myself therewith fully Satisfied Content
ed and paid, have bargained and sold and of these presents do
bargain and sell and peaceable and Quietly Deliver unto Rich.
Richs all my Estate viz. nine head of Cattle, four Cows, one heifer
three Steers and one Bull calf marked with a Crop & Underheel
in each ear and overheel in the Right and their Increase, three
Mares and two Fillies and their Increase, nine head Sheep mark
as above and their Increase, three feather Beds & furniture four
Iron pots hooks & Nails, two Brass Kettles, four pewter Dishes
and five Basons and Eleven plates, two Chests with all other
Necessaries Belonging to the said Hoatfield or in anywise
Appertaining thereunto, in Confirmation of the aforesaid
Agreement I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
Seal this second Day of December Anno Dom. one thou-
sand seven hundred and forty nine
