

Lands of the Purchaser or Purchasers his or their Heirs or Assigns shall
 forever hold & enjoy the same free & discharged from all Claims of the
 said Nottoway Nation & their Posterity any thing in an Act of
 Assembly made in the fourth Year of the Reign of the late Queen
 Ann intituled an Act for preventing of Misunderstandings between
 the Tributary Indians & other his Majesty's Subjects of this Colony
 and Dominion & for a free & open Trade with all Indians what-
 soever or in any other Act of Assembly to the contrary thereof
 contained notwithstanding, as by the said recited Act of Assem-
 bly will amongst other things more fully & at large appear.
 And whereas since the passing of the said Act John Simmons
 one of the Trustees abovementioned departed this Life by Reason
 whereof & by the said Act the Surviving Trustees abovesaid have
 full power & lawful authority to Seal & deliver a Deed of Confeffment as
 abovesaid; Now This Indenture Witnesseth that the said John Simmons
 Sam. John Turner, Geo. Shipper, & Water Bailey, Chief Men of the
 Nottoway Nation ^{Indians} aforesaid by & with the Consent of the surviv-
 ing Trustees aforesaid testified by their being made Parties to
 these presents for & in consideration of the sum of Twenty Shill-
 Current Mooney to them in hand paid by the said William Andrews
 have granted bargained & sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirm
 and by these Presents doth grant bargain & sell alien enfeoff
 release & confirm unto the said William Andrews his Heirs &
 Assigns forever two hundred & forty Acres parcel of the said
 Circular Tract of Land & bounded as followeth, to wit. Beginning
 at a white Oak a Corner of the said William Andrews's other
 Land by the side of the long Branch then N. 53 E. 160 Pole to a
 Lightwood Post in John Simmons's line thence by the said
 Simmons's line N. 5 W. 96 Pole to a white Oak & N. 30 W. 90 Pole to a
 Pine N. 00 W. 56 Pole to a white oak in Richard Barker's Minor's
 line thence by the said Barker's Lines S. 35 W. 63 Pole to a Hickory
 & S. 60 W. 110 Pole to four trees chopd inwards then S. 80 W. 36 pole
 to a Pine then S. 50 W. 63 Pole to a Pine in the said William Andrews's
 old line aforesaid thence by the said Williams Andrews's old
 Lines S. 55 E. 16 pole to a white Oak N. 30 E. 150 pole to a pine & S. 20
 E. 113 pole to the Beginning as by the plat & certificate of
