 contained Now this Indenture Witnesseth that
 the said Sam. Frank, ~~Dochter~~ Tom. John Turner,
 George Shipper, Charles, Jack Will & Matt Bailey the
 Chief Men of the Nottoway Indians by & with the
 Consent of the said John Simmons Tho. Cochrane & Ben.
 Edwards Testified being made parties to these presents
 for & in Consideration of the Sum of one Pound fifteen
 Shillings to the Chief Men in hand paid the Receipt
 Whereof is hereby Acknowledged have Granted bargained
 sold Enfeoffed & confirmed & by these presents do Grant
 Bargain sell Enfeoff & confirm unto the S. Ben. Tabor
 his Heirs & assigns one hundred Acres parcel of the
 said Circular Tract of Land Bounded as followeth Be-
 ginning at a pine a corner of John Exum's Land in the
 outside line of the said Nottoway Indians Land thence
 by the said Exum's line South seven Degrees West
 three hundred & fifty Poles to a Lightwood Post then
 South East Eighty Six Pole to a small Black Oak then
