This Indenture made this twelfth day of April in the year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred & fifty- Between John Brown of the County of Southampton of the one part and Charles Simmons of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Brown for an inconsideration of the sum of twenty pounds Current Money to him in hand paid at or before the Envealing and Delivery of these presents the Receipt Whereof he doth hereby Acknowledge Contented & paid Hath granted Bargained and sold aliened and Confirmed and doth by these presents grant Bargain and sell unto the said Charles Simmons one certain Tract or parcel of Land Containing two Hundred & twenty Acres being part of a Tract of Land the said John Brown bought of the Nottoway Indians for three Hundred and seventy by Deed bearing date the first day of January one thousand seven hundred & forty Nine - recorded in the County Court of Southampton reference being thereunto had may more fully appear and Bounded as follows begining at a Post Corner of ind Daniel Bulles

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
