an Act to enable the Nottoway and Nansemond Indians to sell
certain Lands and for other purposes therein mentioned the
chief Men of the said Nottoway Nation were empowered
with the Consent and Approbation of certain Trustees therein
named to sell and convey for the use & Benefit of the said
Nottoway Nation five thousand Acres part of their Tract
of six Miles square lying between their western boundary
of their said Tract & Duckhorne Swamp on the South side
of Nottoway River in the County of Isle of Wight (which part
of the said County of Isle of Wight is since called Southampton)
for the best Price that could be got so as not to be under
