This Indenture Tripartite, made the first Day of January in the twenty third Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Second by the Grace of God of Great Britain France & Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c. and in the Year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred & forty nine Between Sam^l. Frank, Jack Will, John Turner, Wat Bailey, Geo. Shipper Chief Men of the Nottoway Indian Nation of the first part Joseph Gray & Thomas Farrell of the County of Southampton Gent, Surviving Trustees for the said Nation of the second part & John Fort of the County of Southampton of the third part, Whereas by an Act of assembly made in the Eighteenth Year of his present Majesty entitled an Act to enable the Nottoway & Nansemond Indians to sell certain Lands & for other purposes therein mentioned the Chief Men of the said Nottoway Nation were empowered with the Consent & approbation of certain Trustees therein named to sell & convey for the Use & Benefit of the said Nation five thousand Acres part of their tract of Six Miles square lying between their western Boundary of their said Land & Buckhorn Swamp on the south side of Nottoway River in the County of Isle of Wight which part of the said County of Isle of Wight is since called Southampton for the best price that could
