This Indenture Tripartite made the first Day of Janu-  
in the twenty third Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord  
George the second by the Grace of God of Great Britain France  
& Ireland King Defender of the faith &c. and in the Year of  
our Lord God one thousand seven hundred & forty nine  
Between Sam. Frank, Jack Will, John Turner Watt Bailey  
George Shipper Chief Men of the Nottoway Indian Nation  
of the first part Joseph Gray & Thomas Garrell of the County  
of Southampton Gent. Surviving Trustees for the said  
Nation of the second part. and Simon Turner of the County  
of Southampton of the third part Whereas by an Act of  
Assembly made in the eighteenth Year of his present  
Majesty entitled an Act to enable the Nottoway and  
Nansemond Indians to sell certain Lands and for other  
purposes therein mentioned the chief Men of the said  
~~Nottoway~~ Nation were impowred with the Consent &  
approbation of certain Trustees therein named to sell & con-  
vey for the Use & Benefit of the said Nation five thousand Acres  
part of their tract of six miles Square lying between their  
western boundary of their said Land by Duckhorn Swamp  
on the south side of Nottoway River in the County of Isle of  
Wight (which part of the said County of Isle of Wight is since  
called Southampton) for the best price that could be got so  
as not to be under the Rate of twelve pounds ten Shill:  
for every hundred Acres by so that no part of the said  
main Swamp should be included within any such Sale  
& in Order to get the price aforesaid the said Indians  
were obliged to lay of the best of their said Lands in  
several parcels and the remaining part of the said  
Lands included in the bounds aforesaid is barren & of
