Dr. James Kirby This Indenture Tripartite, made the first day of January in the Twenty third year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second by the Grace of God of Great Britain France & Ireland King defender of the faith &c. and in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and forty nine Between Sam. Franko Jack Will, Geo. Shipper Watt Bailey, John Turner Chief Men of the ^{Indians} Nottoway Nation of the first part Joseph Gray & Thomas Farrell of the County of Southampton Gent. Surviving Trustees for the said Nation of the second part and Richard Kirby junour of the County of Southampton of the third part Whereas by an Act of Assembly made in the Eighteenth year of his present Majesty entitled an Act to enable the Nottoway & Nansemond Indians to sell certain Lands and for other purposes therein mentioned the Chief Men of the said Nottoway Nation were impowered with the Consent and Approbation of certain Trustees therein named to sell and convey for the Use & Benefit of the said Nation five thousand ^{more} Acres of their tract of six Miles lying between their western Boundary of their said tract and Duckhorn Swamp on the South side of Nottoway River in the County of Isle of Wight which part of the said County of Isle of Wight is since called Southampton for the best price that could be got so as not to be under the Rate of twelve pounds ten Shillings for every hundred Acres and so that no part of the said main Swamp should be included within any such Sale by in Order to get the price aforesaid the said Indians were obliged to lay out the best of their said Lands in several parcels by remaining

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
