& sell unto the said John Crumpler Junr. his heirs & assigns
forever A certain tract or parcel of Land situate lying
& being on the South side of Black water Swamp in the
County aforesaid containing one hundred & fifty Acres
being the Plantation whereon Capt. W. Crumpler lived on
