

of the said Main Swamp for the best Price that can be got & after any Agreement made for the Sale of the same or any part thereof it shall & may be lawful for the Chief Men of the said Nation together with the Trustees aforesaid or the Survivors or Survivor of them to seal & deliver any Deed or Deeds Indented for the conveyance of the Fee Simple & Inheritance of the said Lands to the Purchaser who immediately after the Execution of such Deed or Deeds shall pay down to the said Trustees for the Uses & purposes in the said Act expressed the purchase Money; and any Deed or Deeds so executed & perfected by acknowledged or proved by the Oaths of three Witnesses in the Court of the said County of Isle of Wight (which part of the said County of Isle of Wight is since called Southampton) or in the General Court of this Colony & recorded in such Court shall be good & sufficient in Law to pass the Fee Simple Estate of such Land so sold by the Purchaser or Purchasers his or their Heirs or Assigns shall forever hold & enjoy the same free & discharged from the Claim of the said Nottoway Indians & their Posterity any former Act of Assembly Usage or Custom to the Contrary thereof in any wise notwithstanding. (their Trustees) the said Somons being since deceased testified by their being made Parties to these presents in Consideration of the Sum of one hundred & fifteen Pounds current Money to them in Hand paid the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained & sold aliened ^{Released} Infeoffed & Confirmed by these presents do grant bargain & sell alien Infeoff release & confirm unto the said William Barnes his Heirs & Assigns forever Six hundred & fifteen Acres parcel of the aforesaid Land as above to be sold & bounded as followeth to wit. Beginning at a white Oak on the Edge of the Low Grounds of Buckhorn Swamp running N by E to a black Oak N 17° E to a Persimmon on the North side the Western Prong then up by the Edge of the Low Ground of the Western Prong to a

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
