thousand seven hundred and fifty one Between William Sirv^y Junr.
Markes of the County of Southampton of the one Part and Thomas Markes of the
same County of the other Part witnesseth that the said William Sirv^y
for and in Consideration of the sum of Ten pounds Current Money of
Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Markes before the sealing
and Delivery hereof the Receipt whereof the said William Sirv^y doth hereby
acknowledge Hath granted Bargained and Sold and doth by these
Presents Grant Bargain and Sell unto the said Thomas Markes his heirs
and Assigns forever a certain Tract or Parcel of Land lying and being in
the County of Southampton aforesaid Containing eighty Acres granted
to William Sirv^y in a Patent the first day of June 1750 and Bounded as
by the said Patent may appear / to wit / Beginning at a Maple by the
side of the Mirey branch a corner of Daniel Doyle's land Then by the
said Doyle's South Twenty five Degrees West forty six poles to a red
Oak and South Sixty Degrees East one hundred & ten poles to a pine
thence South Sixty seven Degrees West Twelve poles to a Hickory in
William Worrel's line thence by the said Worrel's lines South Sixty
seven Degrees West one hundred & twelve poles to a white Oak a
corner of John Lucas's land thence by the said Lucas's lines North Seven
ty five Degrees West one hundred & two poles to a Spanish Oak then
North Twenty five Degrees East fourteen pole to a Hickory a corner
