

This Indenture made this Eighteenth day of November  
in the year of our Lord god one thousand seven hundred and fifty  
two between Thomas Johnson and Elizabeth his wife of South-  
ampton County of the one part and Joseph Larke of the above-  
County of the other part Witnesseth that the s: Thomas Johnson  
and Elizabeth his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of  
fifteen pounds Currant money of Virginia to him in hand by the  
said Joseph Larke at or before the Ensealing & delivery of these  
presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and  
hereof and forevery part and parcel thereof doth Clearly  
acquit and Discharge the s: Joseph Larke his Executors ad-  
ministrators and every of them by these presents hath granted  
alieneed Released and Confirmed and by these presents doth  
grant alien release and confirm unto the s: Joseph Larke in his  
actual possession now being by virtue of a bargain and sale to  
him thereof made bearing date the day before the date hereof  
and force of the Statute for transferring uses into possession and  
to his heirs and assigns forever all that his plantation and  
tracts of Land thereunto adjoining situate lying and being  
in the County aforesd and Contains by Estimation one hundred  
and five acres be the same more or less Beginning by a dividing  
line at a pine on Thomas Johnsons corner running Northwest  
Course to a white oak on greatoughmans swamp from thence  
running up the s: Swamp to a pine in the mouth of the buckle-  
berry branch thence up the said branch a South east Course to  
a red oak corner tree on the old line thence running East course  
to the beginning pine with all the estate Right Title interest  
Reversion & Reversions Remainder and Remainders  
Yearly or other Rents and profits of the premises and of Every  
part and parcel thereof to have and to hold the s: plantation  
on and tract of Land and all and singular and other the pre-  
mises herein before mentioned and intended to be hereby  
granted with the Appurtenances unto the s: Joseph Larke and  
his heirs to the use of the s: Joseph Larke and of his heirs and  
Assigns forever and the s: Thomas Johnson and Elizabeth
