Witnesseth that the said Richd. Hamlin for and in consideration of the sum of four
- teen pounds current money to him in hand paid by the said Isaac Mason at and before
the sealing & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Richd. Hamlin doth
hereby acknowledge the said Richd. Hamlin granted Bargained and sold alienated
Enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant Bargain and sell Aliens of
yours unto the said Isaac Mason his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcell
of land containing by estimation one hundred & Ninety Acres more or less situate lying
and being in the County of Southampton and bounded as followeth beginning at a white oak a
corner of Robt. Reeks's Land to another white oak thence to a black oak in Lazarus Joyner's
line thence by the said line to a white oak thence Northly west to three trees sharpened inward
thence North to a pine thence North to another pine in William Hornis line thence to the said
line Northwest to a white oak Southwest to another white oak thence South by West to a
lightwood post in Wm Scott's line thence by the said South by East to a red oak South by West
