This Indenture made this 12th Day of September one thousand seven hundred & Fifty three in the twenty sixth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the second Between Thomas Sharp of the County of Southampton of the one Part & James Gardner Junr of the County aforesaid of the other Part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Sharp for and in Consideration of the Sum of Seventy Pounds Curr: Money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said James Gardner Junr at or before the sealing & Delivery of these Presents to the receipt whereof the said Tho: Sharp doth hereby acknowledge he the said Tho: Sharp hath Granted sold & sold & doth by these Presents Grant bargain & sell alien & confirm unto the said James Gardner Junr his heirs & assigns forever Three certain Tracts or parcels of Land lying & being in South: County aforesaid the first Three Hundred Acres lying on the East side the Cedar Swamp granted by a patent to one Rob: Bryan by the Hon: Hugh Draydale Governor bearing date 1724 & sold by Rob: Bryan to the aforesaid Tho: Sharp Forty acres of the aforesaid Land sold to Rob: Darden by the said Tho: Sharp out of the South East Side the aforesaid Patent joining the County line as the said Darden's Deeds will make more fully appear the Residue being 260 Acres now sold to the said James Gardner Junr Beginning at a Red Oak marked Three Ways & bounded according
