Indenture of Troffment bearing Date the firstenth Day of November 1752 have
sold and Conveyed unto Joshua Nicolson of the said County the Fee simple Estate
and Inheritance of Vis a Certain Tract or Parcel of Land lying & being in the aforesaid County
Containing one hundred and ten acres more or less And Whereas the said Elizabeth
cannot conveniently Travel to our said County Court of Southampton to make
acknowledgment of the said Conveyance Therefore We do give unto you or any two
or more of you Power to Receive the Acknowledgment which the said Elizabeth shall
be willing to make before you of the Conveyance aforesaid Contained in the said
Indenture which is hereunto annexed And we do therefore Command you that
you do Personally go to the said Elizabeth and receive her acknowledgment of the
same and examine her privily and apart from the said John her Husband whether
she doth the same freely & Voluntarily without his Persuasion or Threats? and
whether she be willing the same should be Recorded in the Court of our said County
and when you have received her acknowledgment and examined her as aforesaid
that you distinctly and openly Certifie us thereof in our said Court under
your Seals sending then there the said Indenture & this Writ Witness

May in the twentieth year of our Reign
