This Indenture made this 28 day of September in the
year 1802. Between Henry Suter and wife of Sampson county of the one
part
To
George Gannon and wife of the said county of the other part. Witnesseth that
the said Henry Suter for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred
and fifty dollars - to them in hand paid by the said George Gannon
the receipt where of the said Henry Suter and wife hath granted and
acknowledged they the said Henry Suter and wife first granted unto
the said George Gannon and wife their right and lawful title and interest
in and to all that certain tract or piece of land containing ninety seven
acres the more or less situate lying and being in the county
of Sampson on the north side of Black Creek - Beginning at a light
wood post a corner of Lawrence Sowers and the corner said thence
S 39 W. 120 poles corner maple in Black Creek Swamp thence
the various courses of the said swamp downwards to a corner pin
in Mathews Butts line thence along the said Butts line leaving
the said swamp N. 13 W. eleven poles thence N 80 W. seven
poles of meadow here to the beginning Lightwood state containing 9 poles
to being apart of Lawrence Sowers land, and also which his son Lawrence
bought by decree of the Court of S. C. County and also all trees woods
underwoods common common of Pastures pasture Commons and
rights and liberties and whatsoever to the said tract of
land above mentioned belonging or in any way appertaining
or in or about the same growing happening arising and also the
reversions and reversions common and reversions with and services
of the said premises and of every part and parcel thereof and also
all the estate Right Title Interest claim and demand whatsoever of
them the said Henry Suter and wife of and to the said premises
and every part thereof to have and to hold all and singular the said
premises above mentioned and withpast and parcel thereof with
the appurtenances unto the said George Gannon his heirs and
assigns with the only right use and behoof of the said George Gannon
his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry Suter to them
sell and their heirs the said tract of land above said thence
