

The claim of all human whatever the right and title of said property to Thomas Harrison his heirs and assigns forever, provided nevertheless that should as on this Convention that if William Davis his heirs or assigns shall pay unto the said Thomas Harrison the sum of Forty Eight Pounds Four Shillings and 7/2 like money before mentioned on or before the 25th December next then these shall cease and become void. However it is agreed by both Parties that all the possession has been given to Thomas Harrison by William Davis of the same species of Property mentioned in this Mortgage yet it is agreed by Thomas Harrison that until default is made in the said Convention by the non payment of the said sum of money it shall be lawful for the said William Davis to enjoy the use and benefit of the said property without interruption from Thomas Harrison or any person claiming under him.
