Know all men by these presents that I, Josiah Durbine of the County of S.ampton being indebted to Thomas Applegate of the said County in the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds Current money of Virginia and being willing and desirous to secure the payment thereof as also the sum of four shillings to me in hand paid by Hambleton Harris as Trustee for the said Thomas Applegate the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged I the said Josiah Durbine have granted, bargained, sold, delivered and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Hambleton Harris as Trustee for the said Thomas Applegate the following property (Viz.) one negro man by the name of Will one negro Girl Cissy and three Leather beds and Furniture to have and to hold unto the said Hambleton Harris his heirs Executors or assigns in special trust and confidence I propose that if the said sum of one hundred and fifty pounds shall remain unpaid unto the said Thomas Applegate his heirs Executors administrators or assigns at or upon the Twenty fourth day of December next ensuing that the said Hambleton Harris or trustee for the said Applegate shall after six months notice in writing upon the aforesaid granted property to public sale and with the money arising therefrom satisfy the aforesaid sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to gether with the interest and cost attending the execution of the trust and the surplus if any return to me my heirs or assigns in Writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of May 1802 —
