This Indenture made this thirteenth day of May
in the year four last Christ 1802 Between James Edwards of the
County of St. James of the first part, Nathan Williams, of the same
County, of the second part, and Lewis Worrell also of the same County
of the third part - Whereas the said James Edwards is indebted
to the said Lewis Worrell by bond bearing date with them
present - four hundred and ten dollars; and the said James
Edwards being willing and desirous to secure to the said Lewis Worrell
the payment thereof, together with the legal interest thereon becoming
and also the cost of procuring, rendering and carrying into effect their
present - Now this Indenture witnesseth - that the said
James Edwards, in consideration of the sum of five shillings to him in hand paid
by the said Nathan Williams the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
has granted bargained sold and by these presents doth grant
bargain and sell unto the said Nathan Williams his heirs and
assigns forever the following negro (to wit) Foney, Pate, and Phillis
together with their ~~future~~ increase. To have and to hold the
aforesaid three negroes with their increase as aforesaid unto him the
S^d Nathan Williams his heirs & assigns, to the only proper
use and behoof of him the said Nathan Williams his heirs
and assigns forever and the said James Edwards, for himself
his heirs Executors and Administrators, doth covenant and agree
to and with the said Nathan Williams that he will from
time to time and all times forever hereafter, warrant and defend the title
of the aforesaid three negroes with their increase as aforesaid
unto the said Nathan Williams his heirs and assigns forever
Upon Specie trust and confidence notwithstanding, and
to for the uses intents and purposes following (Viz^t) the said
Nathan Williams, at any time hereafter, whenever he shall be there-
to requested, make sale of the aforesaid three negroes together with
their future increase, at public Auction, or in any other
manner in which he shall think fit, so as to pay and satisfy the debt, interest and
cost aforesaid just advertising the aforesaid place of sale.
